This year, we are hosting the Europe Congress on the theme "Tourism for all: reinventing ourselves". More than 80 experts from 10 countries over 2 days. Your presence today reflects the strength of your organisation, the universality of the issues it deals with and the rising interest in unifying themes that affect every region of the world.

Since 2018, numerous exchanges and meetings have allowed us to confront the visions of responsible and inclusive benevolent tourism, to enrich and share it. Doing things differently, emphasising innovation, strengthening what already exists, supporting professionals towards a necessary transition of their activity to a greater degree of sustainability and responsibility. Responsible tourism also means tourism that is steeped in history and yet open to future development, that offers long-term benefits to all participants and residents, that is a real boost to local economies, and that allows people to take the time to look at, listen to, share and appreciate the different cultures.
